SUNDAY 10th February 5th Sunday of Ordinary Time Year C

1st Reading: Isaiah 6:1-8

Psalm: Psalm 137:1-5. 7-8

R: Before the angels I will bless you, O Lord.

2nd Reading: 1Corinthians 15:1-11

Gospel Acclamation: (Jn.15:15) Alleluia alleluia! I call you friends, says the Lord, because I have made known to you everything I have learned from my Father. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 5:1-11

Communion antiphon: Let them thanks the Lord for his mercy, his wonders for the children of men, for he satisfies the thirsty soul, and the hungry he fills with good things.

Dear friends,

In today's gospel we have St. Luke's account of Jesus calling his first apostles. Luke places the occasion in the context of the miraculous catch of fish, an event St. John uses as one of his post resurrection events. Which is the historical truth we don't know. It ultimately does not matter because both evangelists are drawing our attention (and that of the disciples) to the power of Jesus over nature. In St. John's case he uses the miracle as an image of the risen life. This is what is to happen in the new creation Jesus has brought about through his death and resurrection. St. Luke uses it to illustrate the world in which the disciples are being invited to participate, becoming, as Jesus says, fishers of men. For us it is worth noting how Jesus in his miracles with nature always does things in abundance. There is no meanness in his multiplication of loaves, the changing water into wine at Cana. His new creation will offer an abundance of riches to all, something we are still working at!
