SUNDAY 10th March 1st Sunday of Lent Year C

1st Reading: Deuteronomy 26:4-10

Psalm: Psalm 90:1-2. 10-15 **R:** Be with me, O Lord, in my distress.

2nd Reading: Romans 10:8-13

Gospel Acclamation: (Mt. 4:4) Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory! Man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory!

Gospel: Luke 4:1-13

Communion antiphon: One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.

Dear friends,

We always begin our Sundays in Lent with the gospel accounts of Jesus being tempted in the wilderness. Today we have St. Luke's version of the story. We know from the Acts of the Apostles, also written by Luke, that he is very keen on the Holy Spirit, so it is not surprising to hear at the start of his account that Jesus is filled with the Holy Spirit after his baptism and is led by that same Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil for forty days. We can see in the three temptations a reflection of the three activities we are asked to concentrate on during Lent. We too are asked to fast. In doing so we too try and understand more deeply what Jesus means when he rebuffs the devil with the words of Scripture: "Man does not live on bread alone". In a similar way we are asked to give alms, to be generous with what we have rather than build up material empires, especially as the devil claims that they are in his gift! Finally, people often fall out with God because he does not use a magic wand to help us. They will believe in him if he helps them out of their misery. Again the thinking is somehow the wrong way round. We begin by trusting in God and allowing him to lead us along the crooked as well as the straight paths. To do all this we too need the Holy Spirit as our guide.

BLESSED JOHN HENRY NEWMAN TO BE CANONIZED

On Wednesday 13th February, the Holy Father approved the canonization of Blessed John Henry Newman, following a meeting on February 12th with Cardinal Angelo Becciu, the Head of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. Pope Francis signed off on a second miracle attributed to the intercession of Cardinal Newman, who was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI in Birmingham, on Sept. 19, 2010, during the papal visit to our country.

The date of his canonization has not yet been announced, but we continue to pray for Blessed John Henry Newman's cause.
